


A Word from the Director

Juvenile Justice

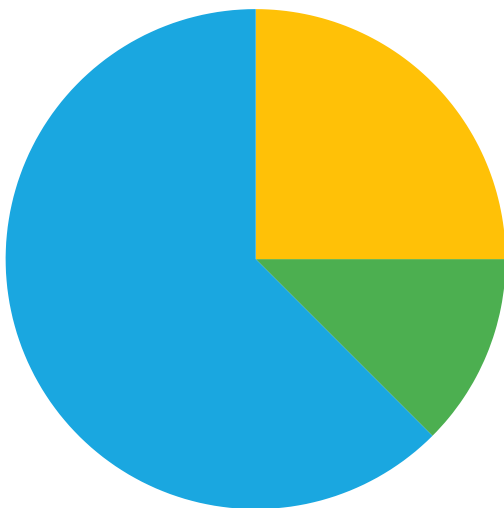
Redeploy Illinois and Second Chance provide intensive services to youth at high risk for incarceration or removal from their community.

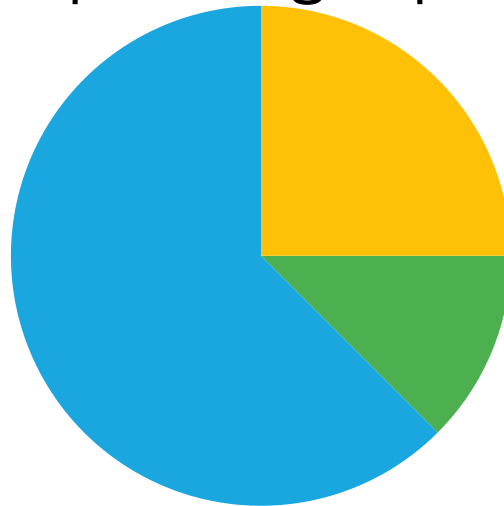

Our caseworkers logged over 1,000,000 miles to make sure that children in foster care stayed connected to their families.

Permanent Homes



YSB exceeded the statewide goal with our permanency rate of over 46%

This means that **202** children now have a secure, permanent home. **145** of those were able to return safely to their families.

Making an Impact

Juvenile Justice

Counselors in our ReDeploy program worked intensively with Taylor* in outpatient therapy, but it just wasn't meeting their needs. This family knew their child needed a higher level of care but couldn't navigate the tangled mental health care system on their own.

The team spent nearly a year researching different options and avenues for residential mental health treatment until Taylor was accepted into a treatment program. YSB worked alongside them to access the care that was needed and continue to stay in touch. Taylor is thriving now and reports that they have made friends, enjoy nature walks, and art therapy.



The Redeploy Illinois Program has reduced the number of young people incarcerated with the IL Dept. of Juvenile Justice in our area from 27 in 2012 to 1 in FY23



Aiden* came into foster care in 2020 when he was two and a half years old. Because of neglect he had experienced, he displayed high levels of physical and emotional stress resulting in tantrums that could last an hour and overwhelm his caregivers. This resulted in multiple changes of placements. Our licensing team went above and beyond to keep finding new homes for him. He was referred for treatment services and play therapy in 2022. There he began to learn to identify and express his feelings and needs and learn ways to calm himself. His clinician was able to assist his caregivers understand his behaviors and learn effective ways to intervene before he lost emotional control.

Solutions Counseling

This summer a young couple pursuing adoption became licensed foster parents and Aiden was placed with them. The adoption process is expected to begin later this fall. Aiden has learned that his foster parents will become his "forever" parents and already show strong attachments with them. He loves attending kindergarten, riding his bike, and going on family trips.



Our Ottawa, Aurora and Peru offices have met the requirements to become Medicaid certified, this makes counseling services more accessible for low income clients.

Making an Impact

Jackie* is a young mother with a 4-year-old daughter. She was determined to get herself and her daughter to safety by leaving an abusive relationship. It was just the two of them, with no other family to turn to. A case worker from our Intact Family Services Program was there for them. YSB helped her obtain housing, daycare, and some personal items. We helped her navigate custody court when her ex tried to obtain custody of their daughter.

On her road to independence, Jackie completed domestic violence services and parenting classes. Less than a year later, Jackie and her daughter are living independently in safe, affordable housing. She is working full time and completing her GED.

The Hispanic Services program is funded by the Illinois Coalition for Refugee Rights which sets annual goals for the number of clients that they assist. In FY23 the team met all of their goals and exceeded several by 150%. They helped nearly 1500 clients access services and build better lives for their families!

YSB team member Alice Berogan was named ICIRR employee of the year for her outstanding service.
